### Message from Mary Mamer, Region 12 Events Coordinator

Exactly 3 months from now we will be gathering again in Sparks for our Annual Convention and Competition. It will be the first live and in person convention since 2019. It's been a long time coming and many things have changed. For myself, I am looking forward to this convention more than any other.

The Regional Convention Steering Committee has a few additional new members. The latest new members are Desiree Hughart in the role of the Facility Manager and Leah Brooks as the Jumbotron Chair. Thank you to Alison Miller who is now the Regional Education Coordinator and Kathy Murtha and Donna Lou Morgan for their years of service on the RCSC. Harriett Feltman will be working with Bonnie Garlow to transition into the role of the Quartet Stroll Coordinator. Thank you, Bonnie, for all you have done over the years. One more change within the RCSC is Convention finance. Nancy Blom will be transitioning to Convention Finance Chair. Thank you to Pattie Hitch who has made an indelible contribution to this position. Each and every member who fills these roles helps our organization stay healthy and strong.

This year we are looking at changing the Saturday evening events so the meal rooms and the Afterglow are on the same floor as the ballroom. There is a large variety of small and large rooms available for choruses to meet and review their scores and celebrate with each other. It will make it easier for the quartets to stroll from group to group and finish at the Afterglow. I do want to encourage choruses to consider using these rooms. This will allow you to spread out more and help reduce the potential of spreading illness. More information will be available in future bulletins.

We have had to reevaluate the price of the All Events Badge. The 2020 Badge price was set at \$90.00 but we didn't have a convention that year. We had hoped we could keep the price the same but over the past three years the cost of everything has gone up. We all experience the price increases every time we go to the grocery store or the gas station. It is no different at the Nugget. In prior years, the convention has made enough money for the region to support the Education events that are held through the rest of the year. Due to declining membership and the increased cost of goods and

services, this year we hope to break even. Our costs for this year's convention are estimated to be approximately \$60,000.00. In order to cover those costs, we will need to raise the price of the All Events Badge to \$110. The Badges are the main source of income at the convention along with income from a few other sources like the Boutique, Program and Jumbotron Ads, Charms, and photos. We are making adjustments in other areas to help reduce the costs but the largest expenses like the stage, sound system, and stage lighting are fixed regardless of the number of people who attend. It was not the decision that anyone wanted to make, but the RCSC and the RMT are trying to remain fiscally responsible.

What fun we all had at the recent AIM weekend! With January behind us, it's time to ramp up for our regional convention in May, only three short months away!

### CHARMS:

We are excited to have the charms back. They are such fun to collect - especially this year when we have been without for the past three years! I have sent out the order form to each chorus and I will need those forms and payment back by Feb. 20<sup>th</sup>. We will need to have a minimum total of 100 charms ordered region wide to move forward with this so please let the charm representative in your chorus know you'd like to order. They are \$20 each and will come in bronze. It's important to let your chorus members know that these may not be otherwise available for purchase at the convention, especially if we don't receive the minimum number of orders that we need, so please get your orders in ahead of time.

### Message from Voula Brown, All Events Badges Coordinator

Please review the information below for the process in connection to badges for regional contest 2023.

All participants and audience must have an All Events Badge.

Badge cost is:

Member All Events	\$110
Guest All Events	\$110
Youth All Events	\$ 50
Single Event Badge (either quartet or chorus)	\$ 60
Youth Single Event	\$ 25
Chaperone All Events	\$ 60

- 1. Chorus and quartet participants must have an all events badge. Single event Badges are for audience members and guests only.
- 2. Each chorus needs a chair to coordinate the chorus and guest badges for their chorus.
- 3. Chorus badge chair will document the name and other information, as requested on the form. Please note: each chorus submits a separate form listing all members and guests, what kind of Badge they need and calculates the amount due.
- 4. All Events Badges will still be available at the registration table for purchase on site.
- 5. One payment from the chorus is used to pay for the entire chorus Badge order. The AEB form is sent to the **RCSC Finance contact**, **Nancy Blom**, via email <u>nancy.blom@gmail.com</u> and the payment (check) is mailed to 12252 Toluca Dr, San Ramon, CA 94583. Checks should be in the mail and completed AEB Form should be emailed as soon as is practicable, but before Monday, March 27, 2023. When emailing Nancy your completed chorus AEB form, please confirm when you mailed her the check.
- 6. Once the finance review is complete, the form is then sent to the regional badges chair, Voula Brown, for printing and distribution.
- 7. To help save on the costs of postage for the region, the badge packages will be available at the regional registration table on Thursday morning of contest weekend. Badge packages will NOT automatically be mailed to choruses. If you would like to get your badge package before the Thursday of contest weekend, please include the cost of postage (flat rate 2nd day priority \$9.65), as indicated on the AEB form and include a mailing address where the package can be received. If you included the cost of the postage, your package will be mailed the week of April 17, 2023.

### SETTLING THE BILL

- A \$100 hold will be placed on the Room Captain's credit card upon arrival.

## Clarification from IHQ regarding 3-year competition requirement

Below is communication from IHQ regarding the 3-year competition requirement. If you have further questions, please contact the Competition Department at <u>competition@sweetadelines.com</u>.

Waiver of policy that is currently active for the 2023 Regional Contest Season:

- At the March 2020 IBOD Meeting, the decision was made to institute a presidential waiver for the 3-year competition requirement for chorus to recharter. Under this waiver, a chorus would have to compete in-person during *either 2022 regionals or 2023 regionals*, which would restart their 3-year competition requirement. Because of COVID-19, a further presidential waiver was granted – this waiver allowed any chorus that participated in 2022 regionals, *in either a live contest setting or by video, in any division,* to have fulfilled their competition requirement, and therefore they would not have to compete at a live contest again until 2025.
- There is no video contest stipulation for 2023. This means that any chorus that did not participate, via video or live during 2022 regionals will need to compete at a live contest in 2023.

Clarifying the process for submitting a presidential waiver request:

- We recognize that there may be choruses who are struggling to rebuild after the last few years of COVID-19. In the event that a chorus believes that they are unable to compete during the 2023 regional contest season, they may request (through their Regional Education Coordinator) a presidential waiver for the 2023 contest season.
- Additionally, if a chorus is granted a waiver but wishes to submit a video for Evaluation Only during the 2023 contest season, they may do so. This option is provided as an educational tool.

Please note: if a chorus is granted a waiver for 2023, they will be required to compete for either placement or evaluation in their 2024 regional contest. If the chorus is unable to fulfill this requirement, they will be unable to recharter in the next fiscal year and will need to choose between entering Revitalization or applying for prospective chapter status.

## **Confirming Competitor Registration**

IHQ sends weekly reports to the Regional leaders showing who's registered for contest. It is the Competition Coordinator's responsibility to verify that competitors are registered in the division in which they intended to register. Additionally, we take this opportunity to create the program entry for the competitor, checking that all information is correct (i.e.; the spelling of names, quartet chapter affiliations, chorus cities, etc.).

My assistant, Kim Machek (<u>kmachek1@gmail.com</u>), will be communicating with you via email to verify all this information. Your swift reply to her would be appreciated.

## **Competitor Forms and other Information**

The <u>Competitor Information for Region Contest</u> packet will provide a list of several forms that will need to be returned to me or my team. Once the Initial Draw for Order of Appearance is done, I will send out a memo that will specifically requests these forms and ask for some other information as well. This information is to be turned in 30 days prior to contest.

Once again Kim will oversee the collection of these forms.

## Briefing

If you are planning to compete, choruses should plan to have their Director and Team Coordinator/President present at the Combined Briefing. Quartets should have at least one representative present at the Combined Briefing.

The briefing will be held on Thursday, May 4<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm in the Nugget Grand Ballroom. Doors will open at 5:30pm for check-in/meet-n-greet.

## **Traffic Patterns**

We will be using the same traffic patterns as we did *way* back in 2019. For your reference, here are the diagrams:

### **Correction to Stage Dimensions**

In the last bulletin, I stated that the "*stage is 60' wide by 36" deep by 32" high*". This was based on a discussion with the Nugget. I was informed recently that the stage is **36**" high rather than 32" high. I apologize for any confusion or worry this might have caused.

## Withdrawing from Competition

After completing the registration process, if a chorus or quartet needs to withdraw from competition for any reason, a written withdrawal notice must be received by International Headquarters. Send email to the Competition Department at: <u>competition@sweetadelines.com</u>.

## **Changing Division**

Competitors may not change from Open Division to either International Division or Evaluation Only after the Final Order of Appearance draw has occurred.

## Use of Mobility Devices

If you plan to use a scooter or wheelchair in the pattern, you must provide your own device. Devices may be rented from the hotel (see the article from the Housing Chair in this bulletin). At a later date, we'll ask for more detail about people who will need to use mobility devices.

### Videographer

I am pleased to announce Region 12 has a new Videographer. His name is John Dietrich and he assisted the region last year during the videotaping session in Eugene, Oregon when our own Randy Sahae was unable to attend due to COVID.

The Videographer Seach Team spent many hours over the past 6 months creating the Request for Proposal, soliciting names of potential videographers, interviewing and answering questions from the potential videographers and finally selecting John. So, if you think about it, say thanks to the team if you see them: Mary Mamer, Randy Sahae, Donna Prochazka, Kim Machek and Joanna Davis

### Video Sales

In past years, our Videographer, Tom Estes, provided a DVD to all competitors containing their individual performance for a fee of \$20 at the end of the competition session. Included with the DVD was an order sheet so that additional copies of the DVD could be ordered.

The Videographer Search team has decided that the video will now be delivered by flash drive to the competitor rather than a DVD and that the competitor may make copies of that video file for personal use by members of the group (quartet or chorus). There will be no after-contest sales of the video.

The cost of the flash drive will be \$20. The memo that I send out after the Draw for Order of Appearance will have details on ordering the flash drive.

## Permission to Post Video Recording

The following is from the Sweet Adelines International Website:

### Permission to Post Video Recordings

By being a competitor in any 2023 Regional Competition, you have been granted permission to post the Sweet Adelines International video recording of your performance, only after your performance has been adjudicated. It is understood that you have obtained all applicable licenses and/or permissions from ASCAP, BMI, and SESAC for your chorus or quartet. Sweet Adelines International reserves the right to revoke this permission for any reason. For specifics regarding social media copyright/licensing rules and regulations, please consult these entities. We appreciate your conscientiousness regarding copyright matters.

By the time the video file is received by the chorus or quartet, it will have been adjudicated. In an email to IHQ, they clarified that this permission extends to individual chorus and quartet members allowing any performer to post the video on their own social media.

## Elevator Privileges for users of Mobility Devices

The Nugget Resort and Casino has agreed to allow persons using a scooter, wheelchair or walker to use the hotel service elevator after the Quartet and/or Chorus contest session.

Rules:

- A **single** assistant may accompany the person using the mobility device.
- Anyone using the service elevator **MUST** be accompanied by a hotel security guard.
- This privilege is only available after the end of the Quartet and Chorus contest sessions. The person using the mobility device must use the public elevator at all other times during the convention weekend.

In 2019, it was noted that this privilege was abused (i.e.; a crowd of people accompanied the person using the mobility device rather than a single individual). A member of the RCSC will be on hand this year to help enforce the rules state above.
