Objectives (at the end of the class, participants will be able too)

- Have some new ideas about how to approach the topic of fundraising in their chorus.
- Have some new ideas about fundraising activities

Definition of Fund-Raising for the purpose of this class:

- A non-singing activity that brings money to the chorus.
- The activity may be done by individual members or members working as a group.

Topic 1. When does a chorus need to do fund-raising?

Topic 2 - Are there any choruses who do not do fund-raising? Why not?

Topic 3. Financial philosophies. Help in determining the value of a proposed activity.

Examples of Financial Philosophies

Treat all members equally for any financial considerations of the chorus. There shall not be any "point systems" or other devices established which determine "rewards" based on a member's efforts.

Recognize that the ultimate responsibility for costs of individual membership are up to each member, yet make a sincere effort to support required expenditures on behalf of all members.

Keep dues at a level to cover basic operating expenses when possible.

Initiate only those fund-raising projects within the chorus that are determined to be fiscally prudent and worthy and which have the active support of enough chorus members to make the project work.
